




PEG SHARK



Lesson focus and goals

Eugenie loved sharks. To remind us that sharks are amazing creatures we will make a peg shark today. Encourage the children to listen and follow instructions carefully.

Materials Needed

- Peq
- Google eyes
- Shark Print Out
- Felt tip pens
- Clear glue
- Scissors

Toothpicks

Instructions

Step 1

Cut the bottom and top part of the shark out. You can color in the bottom a different color

Step 2

Cut the fish and color it in orange. Cut the top of a tooth pick just big enough to fit into the sharks mouth. Bostick the toothpick to the back of the orange fish.

Step 3

Bostick the the bottom of the toothpick to the back of the bottom of the shark.


Step 4


Bostick the shark body pieces to the clothespin, starting at the spring leaving the handle end exposed.


Step 5

Glue on the googly eye.

RACES



Lesson focus and goals

Today the children are going to do 2 Relay Races. The activities should not take long today so use the extra time to go through the book- asking them their favourite page or animal.

Materials Needed



Skateboards

Activity 1 - Flipper Races

Divide the children into to teams and line them up with space to run. You can either pick a wall or something for them to touch or put out two chairs for them to run around and back.

Put a pair of flippers infront of each team. When you blow the whistle the first child in each team will put on the flippers and run there and back, touching the hand of the next team member to go.


The winning team is the first team to all have run and is sitting down with their hand on their heads.


Activity 2 - Skate/Swim Race


Line the children up as in the Flipper Race. This time each team will have a skateboard instead of flippers. When you blow the whistle the first child in each team will lie on their stomach on the skateboard and pretend to swim to the marker and back again.

The winning team is the first team to all swum there and back and are sitting down with their hand on their heads.









DREAM JOB



Lesson focus and goals

Eugenie had her dream job. A job she was passionate about and loved doing every day. Today ask the children what their dream job would be and ask them to make a art work about their dream job.

Materials Needed

- A4 paper
- Oil Pastels
- Magazines
- Scissors
- Glue Stick

Activity 1 - Dream Job Collage

The children can look through the resources on different jobs and then use their creativity to create a picture about their dream job. They can use the oil pastels and cut and paste magazine pictures if they would like.
